SAS Principal Clarice Peninger Retires After 24 Years

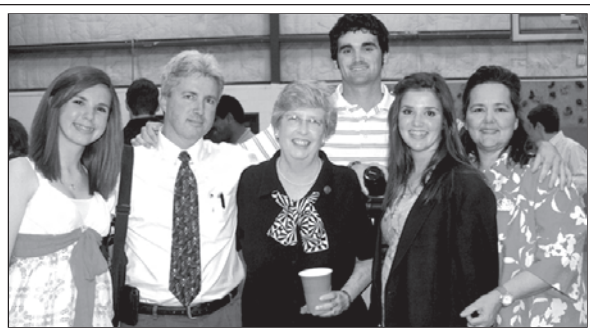


Ms. Peninger, left, with her sister who traveled from Beaumont, Texas for the celebration.

After 24 years as principal of St. Andrew's Catholic School, Ms. Clarice Peninger retired at the end of the 2008-09 school year. Over 500 people attended a Mass and reception honoring her service. Since 1985, Clarice has been instrumental in making SAS the premier Catholic elementary school in Fort Worth. Clarice began with leveling reading and math, spearheaded a parish capital campaign that tore up the old black top to create a beautiful courtyard and transformed the old church/auditorium into a two story modern 7th and 8th grade wing complete with a high school science lab along with an art, music and Spanish room. In 1993, SAS integrated the preschool classes from St. Bartholomew's. And, just this year, a new Kindergarten building opened. The previous Kindergarten rooms were renovated to a faculty work/lunch room and a copy room. During her tenure, the school budget went from \$640,000 to \$3.5 million dollars. It was a busy and progressive 24 years!



In honor of her retirement, over \$13,000 was donated for the Clarice Peninger Tuition Assistance Fund. The school presented her with a new Apple computer and software. Plus, the faculty and staff gifted her with \$1,000 in cash. Many wishes for a healthy, joy-filled and well-deserved retirement.
